I. Introduction to AHEPAcademy

AHEPAcademy is a program that identifies, educates, inspires, mentors, advances, and networks exceptional Greek-American high school students as they progress through their high school, college, graduate and professional careers. The program includes a one-week AHEPAcademy on Campus session that invites one Candidate (a Greek-American high school junior selected and sponsored by a local AHEPA Family Chapter) each summer to participate in an intensive academic and interactive program in the Washington, DC area, facilitated by prominent Greek-American and Philhellene instructors from the academic, professional, and public service fields. Graduates of the AHEPAcademy on Campus session are eligible for further mentoring, access to a nationwide network of internships, and participation in continuing internet-based networking and learning opportunities throughout the end of high school, college, graduate school, and beyond.

AHEPAcademy 2010

AHEPAcademy 2010 will be available to a small number of exceptional students selected and sponsored by participating AHEPA Family Chapters (i.e., AHEPA, Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, Maids of Athena) from across the United States and Canada. Please contact AHEPAcademy at info@AHEPAcademy.com and your local AHEPA Chapter to indicate your interest in applying as soon as possible and to confirm that your local Chapter is participating in sponsoring students with scholarships for AHEPAcademy on Campus. Given the cost of participating in AHEPAcademy, it is highly recommended that a student seek to obtain a scholarship from his or her local Chapter when applying, however a student's lack of scholarship funding will not necessarily determine whether or not they are accepted into the program.

The 2010 sessions of AHEPAcademy on Campus will take place from June 20-26, 2010 and July 25-31, 2010 on the campus of George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, in the Washington, DC suburbs. If selected as a Candidate, students will be expected to arrive on the Sunday afternoon and will be expected to remain at AHEPAcademy until Saturday morning of their respective sessions. Candidates and their families will be responsible for transportation costs to and from AHEPAcademy. (Transportation to George Mason University from both Reagan National and Dulles Airports will be provided on Sunday afternoon as well as to the airports from campus on the following Saturday.) Each sponsoring AHEPA Chapter will pay for their Candidate's food, lodging and other program related expenses during the Candidate's participation in the AHEPAcademy on Campus session from a \$1,000 AHEPAcademy Scholarship payable directly to AHEPAcademy. If a student is unable to secure scholarship funding but is otherwise accepted into the program, it is the responsibility of the student and the student's family to pay the \$1000 tuition to attend the program.

Second Session/Consolidated Session: In order maintain its philosophy of smaller class sizes and recognizing that many qualified students may have a scheduling conflict with participating in the June 2010 session, AHEPAcademy is offering a July 2010 session scheduled for the last week of July 2010. Applicants are encouraged to mark whether they are available for either one or both of these sessions and to specify their preference on attending either session.

If based on applications received by the Application Deadline, there are not enough accepted students who are able to attend either the first or second session to create a large enough class session, AHEP Academy will reserve the right to cancel either session and invite accepted students to attend the remaining session. The need for a second session will be determined based on the applications received by the Application Deadline and AHEP Academy reserves the right to not offer or cancel the second session based on demand for one or both sessions.

II. Eligibility

To be eligible to attend AHEP Academy, the Applicant must demonstrate that:

1. The Applicant is a High School Junior during the 2009/2010 Academic Year. A High School Junior is a student who is currently in the next to final year of high school. An Applicant who applies for the 2010 class of AHEP Academy will be expected to attend AHEP Academy on Campus during the Summer of 2010 and will have one final year of high school remaining, with graduation from high school in the Spring of 2011.
2. The Applicant maintains a cumulative minimum 3.5/4.0 unweighted grade point average or its equivalent or is in the top 10% of his or her high school class. Applicants must submit the most recently issued transcript corresponding to their Application Submission Date and may be asked to provide an updated transcript by their local AHEPA Chapter or by AHEP Academy during the evaluation and selection of Candidates. Applicants submitted weighted transcripts must also submit an explanatory document provided by the school describing how these weighted grades compare to unweighted grades issued by the school.
3. The Applicant is member of either the Sons of Pericles or Maids of Athena. Alternatively, any of the Applicant's parents or grandparents can be members in good standing of AHEPA or the Daughters of Penelope. (An Applicant who has a deceased parent or grandparent that was a member in good standing of AHEPA or the Daughters of Penelope at the time of his or her death meets this eligibility requirement.) If the Applicant or any of the Applicant's parents or grandparents are not currently members of any of the AHEPA Family Organizations (AHEPA, Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, or Maids of Athena) and the Applicant does not otherwise meet this eligibility requirement, either the Applicant or any of the Applicant's parents or grandparents can join the applicable AHEPA Family Organization concurrently with the Applicant's application submission by the Application Submission Date in order to satisfy this eligibility requirement.
4. The student is of Hellenic Heritage.

Any questions or disputes regarding a student's eligibility for AHEP Academy will be referred by the local AHEPA Chapter to AHEP Academy for resolution.

III. Filing Requirements

A hard copy of the application form with the required attachments, constituting an Application Submission, must be submitted to the student's sponsoring AHEPA Chapter with an electronic copy of the same to applications@AHEPAcademy.com. (Completed applications with attachments should be scanned in PDF format as one file for electronic submission purposes. If you do not have ability to scan or create a PDF version of your application form and the required attachments, please contact AHEPAcademy at applications@AHEPAcademy.com for alternate filing instructions.)

The following documents are required for a complete AHEPAcademy Application Submission:

1. A completed AHEPAcademy Candidate Application Form 2010.
2. An official high school transcript, most recently issued before the Submission Deadline. Applicants may supplement their Application Submission with an updated transcript if the Applicant's school regularly issues grades between the Submission Deadline and April 15, 2009. AHEPAcademy may also in some cases request updated transcripts to finalize its selection of Candidates.
3. An official copy of the student's most recent SAT or ACT scores or PSAT/NMSQT scores, if applicable.
4. A copy of the AHEPAcademy 2010 Candidate Essay Submissions.

Hard copy Application Submissions must be either hand-delivered or certified mailed, return receipt requested, to the sponsoring Chapter by March 1, 2010 for Early Action Consideration. A copy of the Application Submission must be emailed to AHEPAcademy at applications@AHEPAcademy.com by 11:59 P.M. EST on March 1, 2010. Applicants should maintain a copy of this completed application for their records.

Failure to timely file all these items may penalize the scoring of the student's application or result in the rejection of the student's application.

AHEPAcademy applications received after March 1, 2010 and by April 1, 2010 will be considered under the Extended Application Deadline. Students who apply by March 1, 2010 will receive favorable consideration over similarly situated applicants who apply after this March 1, 2010 deadline and will have first choice of attending the first or second session should there be a need to limit the numbers of either session.
